



Financial Aid for study abroad is sometimes available through individual academic departments at Wichita State. The Office of International Education administers all other study abroad scholarships, which are made possible through the following sources: Government Association (SGA), the James S. Garvey International Center Endowment, the Gatewood Scholarship Fund, and the Dr. Dharma DeSilva Endowed International Business Scholarship fund.

Student Government Association (SGA) Study Abroad Scholarship

Each year the SGA votes on the approval of funds that are to be used to help WSU undergraduate and graduate students major in any subject who want to study overseas for at least one academic semester as part of their degree program. The applicant must demonstrate that he or she is enrolling in a program approved for academic credit as certified by the Office of International Education.

Garvey Study Abroad Scholarship

These scholarships are open to both undergraduate and graduate students from any major who wish to study in another country as part of their curriculum. Between five and ten scholarships from \$500 to \$1,500 are usually awarded annually. James S. Garvey was an international business man, who was named a Distinguished Alumnus and Newcomer honoree and served on the Wichita State Alumni Association Board of Directors. When he passed away in 2001, the Garvey International Center was established in his memory to house the various offices providing services to international students. At the same time, his family established the James S. Garvey Endowment.

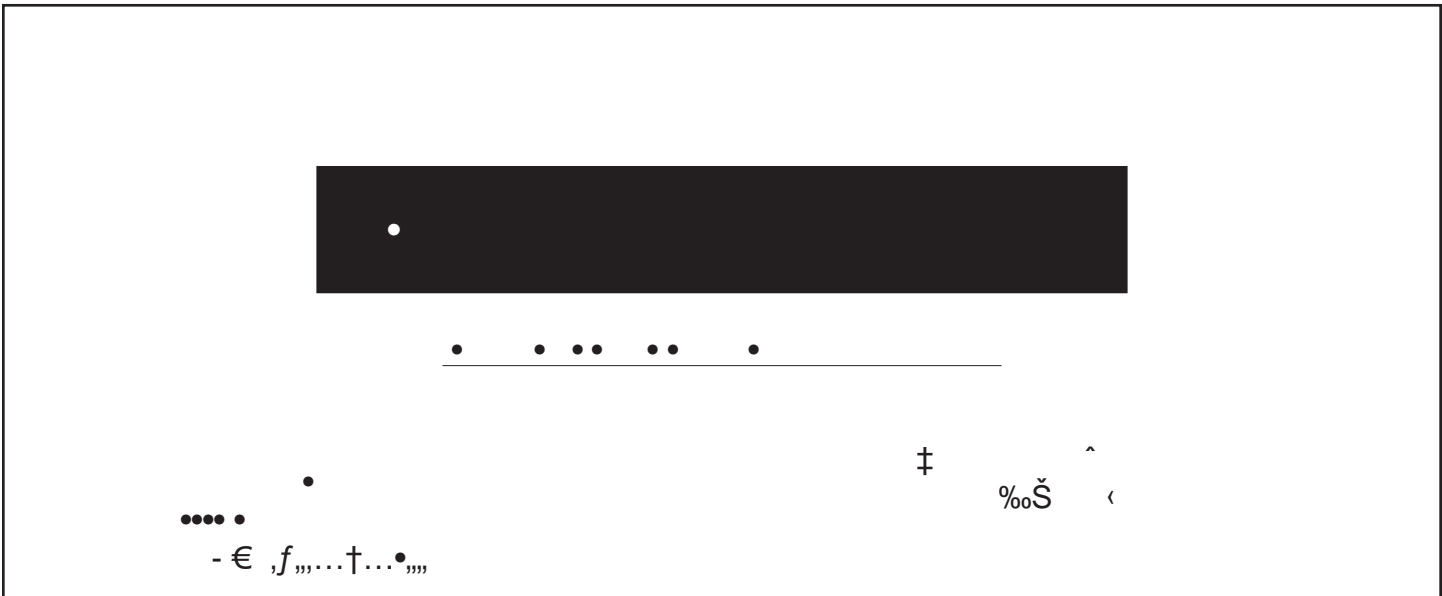
Gatewood Study Abroad Scholarship

This scholarship gives priority to undergraduate Political Science and International Studies majors who will be studying abroad in the Fall, Spring or Summer. Between 4-8 scholarships of \$1,000-\$2,000 are available annually. Mr. Michael Gatewood is a distinguished alumnus of the Political Science department and supports opportunities for students to gain valuable international travel experience. Students must have and maintain 2.8 GPA for this scholarship.

Dr. Dharma DeSilva Endowed International Business Scholarship fund.

These scholarships are available to undergraduate students who are pursuing BBA degree with International Business major or minor; or Economics majors (BA) with an international business minor, students with International Studies major (business option). Preference will be given to students who are active members of the International Business Studies Association (IBSA). Each recipient is eligible for one-time \$1,500 scholarship from this fund. Students must have and maintain 2.75 GPA for this scholarship.

IMPORTANT: All of the scholarships listed above require the same application, and applicants do not need to designate a particular scholarship in their application. They will automatically be considered for any funds in which, they meet the eligibility requirements. Applications will be accepted after deadlines listed below based on a case-by-case basis and availability of scholarship funds.



Eligibility for all awards:

1. Undergraduate students should have completed a minimum of 30 hours by the time of departure. Graduate students should have completed at least 9 graduate credit hours.
2. Students should have and maintain a minimum 2.5 overall GPA and some scholarships will have a higher GPA requirement
